It felt like a couple of weeks when I wrote last but I realised a whole term has gone past since I did! We had a really exciting mission week at the University of KwaZulu Natal (UKZN) at the beginning of August. The talks drew a good number most days (apart from when Julius Malema visited campus!) and it was excellent to engage with people each day beforehand. Evangelism skills were challenged and sharpened! In our slightly less-effected area, trees are down in many roads. The cost of damages is estimated at one billion rand. Please pray for the city to recover physically and for lives to turn to bow to the Lord of all.

And a little review of what has happened in other parts of life... I had a very interesting time at my neighbour's daughter's wedding (see pic!). The Hindu priest explained the procedures well and I was welcomed. I couldn't help but see that 'they... exchanged the glory of the immortal God for images made to look like mortal man and birds and animals and reptiles' (Romans 1:22). Please pray for witness to Jesus Christ as I continue to get to know the family better.



The end of the university year is nearing as students now wrap up lectures and go into exams. Please pray for a great End of Year function on Friday 27 October organised by the apprentices and student committees of each campus. Please pray they would be equipped to stand firm in the Lord Jesus during time with family and friends and to be used to spread the true gospel in their home areas. Thanks to The Gospel Coalition we have given out hundreds



of 'Prosperity? Seeking the True Gospel' (an excellent book!) and had the opportunity across the two campuses to tell the gospel to about 500 students across the year. Please pray for fruit to grow in the holidays in the hearts of those who have received and heard.
